


Wellington EcoHub

Sustainability Trust, Wellington's community environment leader is creating a public environment centre in the heart of Wellington city. The centre, which we are provisionally calling *The Wellington EcoHub* will be the central Go-To point for Wellington residents interested in information, advice, and services to lower their environmental footprint and improve quality of life.

Wellington region does not currently have a dedicated community facility or education and resource space for environmental sustainability. With *The Wellington EcoHub*, we will provide a welcoming and informative venue for Wellington's residents, visitors, businesses and wider community. Our skilled advisors will play a leading role in the new centre, assisting households, schools, social services and businesses to make positive changes to their social and environmental footprint.











FEATURES

Public Displays, Exhibitions and Information

Hosting environmentally focused projects and information.

- Energy efficiency: insulation, heating, renewable technology, curtains, etc
- Water conservation: low-flow devices, rainwater collection, etc
- Waste minimization: composting, recycling, recovering
- Urban food production: community gardens, orchards, bee-keeping, etc.
- Transport alternatives: cycling, walking & transport info, electric cars

Demonstration

Features within the actual build of the hub will demonstrate sustainable living techniques. Interactive elements will assist in learning about sustainability and implementing components in household.

- Organic collection, composting and worm farming
- Efficient heating and cooling systems
- Water catchment devices and energy efficient appliances

Community Space

The space is being designed with community at the forefront and will include:

- Screen for public film screenings including Reel Earth Film Festival
- Free public resource library with sustainability and social equity focused books and DVD's
- Workshops and training, regular community events programme
- Bicycles for public use
- Meeting space to support community groups and projects in Wellington
- Drop off point for e-waste recycling
- On-site education for schools and community groups
- Signposting to complementary social and health services
- Community Events, including Green Drinks and Community Networking activities

Retail Space

An EcoShop will contain products and services that support sustainable living:

- Insulation, energy-efficient heating, ventilation options
- Compost bins, Bokashi bins
- Books, magazines
- Recycled and refurbished electronics
- Goods made by our staff from donated fabric (doorsnakes, aprons etc).

EcoAdvice Service

- Onsite sustainability advisors offer specific advice for sustainable living
- Tailored information and resources for individual needs
- Home Sustainability Auditing Service
- Sustainable Living Workshops: general and tailored to meet needs of the community
- Tours and demonstrations of hub features















FLOOR PLAN: NEW SUSTAINABILITY TRUST PREMISES & ECO-HUB, 49 TORY STREET, WELLINGTON

Location

The Trust has secured 750m² of ground floor space in the Aldgate building on Tory St and just steps from Courtenay Place, a main arterial route across Wellington, close to bus and train services. http://bit.ly/vroMj4

The main entrance will be via Forresters Lane, a laneway off Tory St. that lends itself to providing a "shared-zone" including garden space, pedestrian seating, bicycle and car parking.

The main entry will immediately open into the +200m² EcoHub while the remaining internal area will house current Trust administrative office, business activities and community programmes.













The Build

Approach

Aligning with our core values, we aim to minimize the overall environmental footprint of the fitout process and for this process to be part of the educational aspect of the EcoHub.

The Trust is aiming to propagate principles of green star building rating which offer the ability to celebrate sustainability on several levels. Where possible we aim to partner on these elements with dedicated organisations and businesses to demonstrate what can be achieved.

Context

The existing building is currently a disused and windowless storeroom in a downtown location. We plan to inject it with a new and vibrant community function. It is undergoing major external renovations, carried out by the owner, including a new 120m² glass frontage that will provide natural light and activate the laneway. The internal fit-out is being carefully designed and managed by Sustainability Trust.

Sustainability Focus Areas:

ENERGY

The 120m² of glass frontage is north-facing providing the opportunity to design for active and passive solar energy technology. Using recovered and recycled material where possible reduces energy production for new material.

WASTE

The Trust's rigorous fit-out process will boast 90% re-used, recovered and recycled materials. Our builders will keep detailed records of materials used, including deconstruction to reconstruction. The process will be documented and celebrated as an example of attainable waste minimisation in building projects. With many of our required building elements being donated and/or recovered we can confidently calculate the reduction in new resources, VOC's, and embodied energy.

WATER

Raintanks and rainbarrels will be used to demonstrate opportunities for urban rainwater harvesting. These displays will be used alongside other water conservation techniques such as flow restrictors, water efficient appliances and gardening techniques.

GREEN

The laneway is being upgraded and an urban garden will be established helping restore green habitat into an urban cul-de-sac. EcoHub gardens will demonstrate the possibility of edible gardens for city residents. Living partitions will be included within the office area of the Trust, creating a living, breathing, healthy workplace.
